

Dear Colleagues,

Thank you to all who have completed the statewide current practice survey for pharmacist licensed in the state of New Hampshire. As of today, we have collected over 558 thoughtful responses from your colleagues (20% response rate), which is getting us closer to our target response rate. We want to be sure all pharmacy practice sectors and voices from the field are included and will be sending out weekly reminders until we've received at least a 30% response rate (or just over 800 responses).

As a reminder, this survey was developed by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Public Health Services (DPHS), in collaboration with the New Hampshire Board of Pharmacy, New Hampshire Pharmacists Association, and the New Hampshire Society of Health-System Pharmacists. The purpose of the survey is to understand current practices, barriers, and needs related to Medication Therapy Management (MTM), Collaborative Practice Agreements (CPA), and Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support (DSMES) to help increase patient outcomes for those diagnosed with prediabetes, type 2 diabetes, and heart disease over the next five years through a cooperative agreement with The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) titled Improving the Health of Americans through Prevention and Management of Diabetes and Heart Disease and Stroke (CDCRFADP18- 1815).

The information collected is anonymous and will be analyzed in aggregate to inform efforts to increase awareness of and enhance MTM, CPA, and DSMES services, and to meet training needs of pharmacists in New Hampshire. **The survey will take about 12 minutes to complete and the link will be open until May 2, 2019.**

Survey results will be shared with pharmacists and interested stakeholders throughout the state by June 2019. Only summary information will be reported.

Your response is very important, as it will help us work to highlight the important role of pharmacists as part of the patient care team, particularly in managing chronic conditions.
