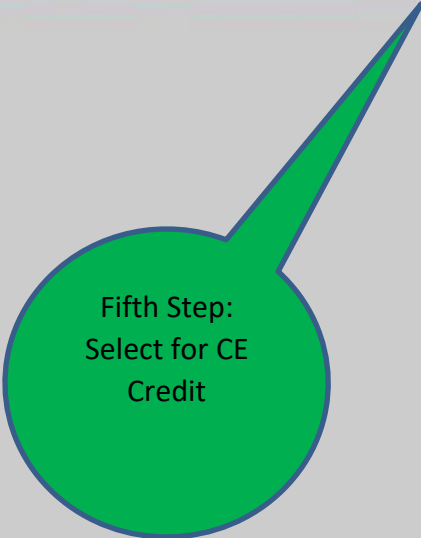

All evaluations and post-test must be completed within **7 days**, and the credits will appear on the CPE Monitor within **30 days**.
